No Kresge students involved in club but the event isn't designed for a specific type of student. Anyone can be involved in the public health discipline. Will invite orgs to table. Requesting \$200.00

Redwood Grove- formerly Kresge East

<u>The situation</u>: Kresge East has been taken from Kresge College. Next year it will serve as multi-college housing and will not be affiliated with Kresge College. This takes 115 beds from the Kresge community. Next year Kresge will be the smallest college and therefore the most vulnerable and the easiest to dismantle.

<u>The reasoning</u> (as we know it): Next year UCSC will be admitting fewer students but will have a larger number of beds to fill. They must make on-campus housing look more attractive in order to fill all spaces. Jr's and Sr's have been given higher priority (more likely to live in apartments, more expensive). Offering multi-college living without changing affiliation will also make living on campus more appealing. Rationale is to make the largest possible income to help with the budget crisis.

<u>Unanswered questions</u>: Can we get Kresge East back when the budget gets better? Why is Kresge the only college being dismantled? Why were students not a part of this decision? What does a "resolved" budget look like to admins?

<u>Goal</u>: Parliament will be releasing a letter stating the concerns of the membership regarding the loss of Kresge East. Parliament will conduct a door-to-door survey in order to gain information on the community opinion of this change. Possible actions: hold an informational Town Hall.

<u>Issues</u>: loss of CA jobs, less college representation on campus, less revenue, dismantling the college system in general
