- Would need to find other reductions to come up with the \$125,000 needed for Kresge/Porter DH.
- Dining Hall promotes community and relationships within Kresge/Porter. Great food and hang out place. Time efficient and convenient for tight schedules; hassle to go to other dining halls. The dining halls are crowded. Students and Staff were able to meet and eat together. Uncomfortable for students and employees at other college dining halls. Employees support the opening of the Kresge/Porter DH, they liked working there.
- The employees at the Kresge/Porter Dining Hall backfilled open positions at other dining halls, they were not laid off.
- They have taken into account the costs of having the Kresge/Porter Dining Hall Activity Center there.
