# Kresge Parliament – 11/3/11

Meeting Start: 6:32 Quorum: 14 Ice Breaker: Why are you proud to be a UCSC student?

Guests SUA - Amanda (Chair) DT (Diversity Commissioner) Shazam (Chief of Staff) Amanda updated Parliament on the budget situation with SUA this year. Last summer, Amanda met with their fiscal staff member and was informed that the approved budget for this year was incorrect – over by \$60,000. She also learned there were no bylaws governing mid year amendments to the approved budget. She has been busy hiring a SUA Treasurer until this week but now she is onto this issue. In addition, Amanda wants to add a position - SUA Business Manager (this position is currently in the bylaws but hasn't been in effect for the last few years) She will request a line item in the budget for this additional expense. Officers havecrafted a budget amendment with input from our own Justin R. and after visiting college student governments, an official budget will approved and posted.

- Q. What about cuts that haven't been made?
- A. I feel that we have cut every line item that we can to maintain efficiency of SUA.
- Q. What about parking permits? How does this relate to SUA efficiency?
- A. SUA officers get a B permit, which allows them to run SUA errands. Only 4 officers received parking permits this year for a total of \$3500.
- Q. Are these University vehicles or personal cars?
- A. These are personal cars. The rental of University vehicles would add up to more \$.
- Q. Other students are completely successful without parking permits. We spend so much on bus systems, many students ride bikes, many students walk- this might be an expenditure that could be cut.
- A. This mobility adds to the efficiency of SUA, not only for errands but also for transportation of other people.

Amanda – This is not the right time for this discussion!

- Q. Would you be interested in getting your own parking permit, instead of using SUA funds?
- A. After four months in the job, I didn't account for such an expense. It would be more realistic with notice. We can talk about this during spring budget planning for next year.
- Q. What about a C or even an R permit?
- A. We can look into this.
- Q. What is the situation with SCOC? What is its relation to the SUA budget?
- A. SCOC has their own budget. SCOC is aided with the jobs/work of several members of SUA, so SUA is going to ask SCOC for partial funding for these staff expenses.
- Amanda: Fiscal management and fiscal responsibility is very important to me. I have experience with budgets and was on finance-related committees last year. I want all of you to know this about me and be able to trust me. I will research how this budget mess happened last year.
- Q. Where is the money for a SUA Business Manager coming from?
- A. The budget needs to be re-tweaked for this and after conversations with Student Government groups, I will make my suggestions.
- Q. Will this help with issues like the \$60,000 of overspending in the future?
- A. The Business Manager will be important to make sure overspending is prevented and they can act as a political position (fundraising, etc) unlike the Treasurer.
- Q. I would like to see an internal investigation for SUA.
- A. I'm working on it. I want these questions to be answered as well.
- Q. Instead of jumping with a new Business manager, Can we give the Treasurer time to see what can be done and his capabilities before spending more money?
- A. Possibly but I envision the Business Manager doing fundraising for SUA very important
- Q. The changes being made to the current budget, how long will they be in effect?
- A. Until spring, but the cuts could be kept depending on how the discussions go in spring for the next year. Email questions to Amanda at: chair.sua@gmail.com
