Budget Request: Platypus is a campus organization that analyzes Marxist literature to engage in discussion and create a pamphlet. Last year they held a public panel about state violence, where 30 people attended. This year they are planning to have another panel “What is Marxism and anarchism?” They have Kresge classroom 321 on Feb. 17th at 6:00 p.m. Their goal is to have 100 participants. Inviting well-known speakers such as Cindy Milstein, Ann Roberto and Wayne Price. Expenses include honorariums, plane tickets, hotel rooms and printing. The pamphlets have 9 issues each year and are widely distributed. Requesting \$239, already raised \$629 for a total budget of \$2039.

Deliberation: Confusing request with two budgets. Members are dedicated and their publications are widely distributed. Good to support different views and here at Kresge. Traditionally, we do not fund transportation or housing. We could help with honorarium and printing. This year, we have been consistently supporting publications with \$150.
