

Kresge Parliament – 11/10/16

Meeting Start: 6:00pm **Quorum:** 15 **Ice Breaker:** In light of Tuesday's election, what's one thing you are hopeful for and/or something you will get involved in/activism?

Funding Requests: Film Production Collation (FPC) - FPC is a Student Media Org. and the largest broadcast org. on campus cable TV. Producing short films, entirely made by students. Their jobs, as producers, are to support student artists on editing, writing, shooting and how they all make sense in a film. They host quarterly film festivals to showcase student work. This quarter at the Humanities Lecture Hall on December 6-8pm. Operating expenses include facility fees, single-use access for projectors, props, costumes and advertising. Each film runs about \$200. And they will be asking others for funding. One third of their membership of 70 are Porter/Kresge affiliates. Asking for \$500 of a \$700+ budget. Props will be a long-term investment, meaning that they will be reused.

Scientific Slugs: Scientific Slugs is a full color art & science magazine in its 4th year. Providing a mixture of local research, local artists and journalism experience since UCSC doesn't offer that major. They have 12-13 members and run a blog and Facebook. A spring printing of 1000 magazines, 32 pages, \$3.72 each plus outreach merchandise creates a \$3900. Budget. Asking for \$500. They distribute to cafes, libraries and downtown Santa Cruz. Kresge will get free 100 copies. Will be asking other colleges and SUA.

Deliberations: Fall Treasury: \$700.

FPC – Well prepared, cool events although it is difficult to remember to attend. Tara motions to fund \$150. Joseline 2nds 10 Hoots, 4 Abstain = Approved

Scientific Slugs: The quality of the magazine is very good. Good concept, talked about longevity & outreach Toan motions to fund \$150, Liza 2nds. 14 Hoots, 1 Abstain = Approved.

Redevelopment Subcommittee – Max – Planning a student forum on Nov. 30th from 6-8 p.m. in the Town Hall. Asking Parliament to sponsor the facility cost \$150.00. Total budget \$645. with outreach, educational materials. Toan motions to invite, Celinda 2nds 12 Hoots 1 Screech, 1 Abstain = Approved.

UCSC Ethnic Resource Center - Big Break: Hosted at RCC on Fri. Dec. 2nd from 6-8:30 p.m. Expecting about 350 students. Theme, "Sustaining our Communities" Event includes Pono Hawaiian Grill, cookie decorating, crafts, photo booth. Asking all colleges for \$200. Hana motions to invite, Celinda 2nds. 11 Hoots 4 Abstain = Approved.

OPERS Cruz Fit: An exercise incentive program during winter quarter with 2230 participants last year. Groups track their exercise on-line for an 8-week challenge. Free workshops and tee shirts included. Asking all colleges and other sources for budget goal of \$19,400. Requesting \$500. Tara motions to invite, Toan 2nds. 6 Hoots 5 Screeches, 4 Abstain = Approved.

Red Wheelbarrow: Largest of the 3 literary magazines on campus. They include art, literature and pros. Submissions reviewed by 12 staff members. Expenses are for printing this free publication. Kresge, as a writers' college is always included. Asking all colleges and other sources. Requesting \$500. Tara motions to invite, Liza 2nds. 7 Hoots, 8 Abstain = Approved.

Parliament Business: Provost visit debrief
