- -Porter Café will be opening soon with new vendor, finishing contracts and equipment purchases. Kresge Redevelopment: Not going to be a P3 project (public/private funded) Our campus architects and share holders will develop the project with input from Studio Gang design. Financially, we will not be able to follow the design 100%. Still need to find money for state buildings (administration) Kresge has the housing money and up to 50 million has been earmarked for the academic building from campus wide development account. Timeline is still not set, hoping for 2020. Maybe a fazed project starting with housing units first.
- -New EH&S is building a waste product containment building across from Kerr. It is needed for on campus toxic waste storage. It is going to blend into the woods on polls. Funding came from UCOP = 19 million.
- -Campus stair cases are being replaced across campus as regular maintenance.
- Q &A Q. What is going on with the Porter Lounges, will we get them back? A. Unfortunately, no, they are needed for housing ongoing. Even with the Kresge additional bed spaces, it will not free up the lounges.
- Q. Why are the J/K buildings locked now? A. Response to graffiti issues, precautionary.
- Q. Tuition hikes, can we do anything? A. Approved by the Regents, you should lobby your legislators. There has been a 5-year freeze before this increase.
- Q. LRDP, when will it be finished? A. Currently being developed, Max is on the campus wide committee this year. Committee positions get filled every year.
- Q. Endowment consistency? No progress on campus wide capitol campaign to provide 4 million per college. Ben Leeds Carson, Provost, is working on fundraising for Kresge classes. The campus wide Giving Day is March 8th and Kresge is included.
- **Budget Request:** Christian Colleges against Cancer Relay for Life April 29-30 10 a.m. 10 a.m. on East Field. This 24-hour fundraiser builds community and supports people affected by cancer.
