### **Elections:**

Treasurer: Mike Moreno Perez and Toan Vo both were interested in Treasurer. Both spoke about their qualifications and Parliament discussed both candidates. Hana motioned to elect Toan, lan  $2^{nd}$  12 Hoots, 3 abstain = Approved.

Matt Saccomanno, Hana King and Tara Parcella were all interested in representing. Each spoke about their qualifications and Parliament discussed the candidates. Scheduled from 9 – 11 p.m., Franklin sees a DJ and information tables with donations taken at the door on a sliding scale, no one turned away for lack of funds. There will be a raffle for donated items too. Franklin also pitched this day as a way to give back to Santa Cruz with any kind of volunteer action before this event. Franklin is partnering with Oakes College and Interim Dean of Students Lucy Rojas to provide food sources for UCSC students. ## **Parliament Updates:**

Proposed 2016-2017 Kresge Student Programs Budget – Pam Ackerman CPC Pam presented the proposed budget from her office for this academic year. (Attached) This included line items for Orientation, Commencement, PA Staff salaries, Office funding, Parliament end of year dinner, Kresge Presents PRIDE and the Parliament operating budget. It also included an update on the Kresge Carry Forward Account managed by CAO Mike Yamauchi-Gleason. Four expenditures from this account were included to start off the year. A color printer for the Programs Office, matching funds for the PA staff salaries, Kresge Family Day expenses and our annual support of the OPERS Recreation Scholarships. Parliament discussed the details and Hana motioned to approve, Tara 2<sup>nd</sup> 10 Hoots = Approved.

**Approval of minutes:** Minutes from the last spring meeting were approved. Tara motioned to approve, Toan 2<sup>nd</sup> 7 Hoots, 1 Screech(Carl), 2 Abstain = Approved.

**Report Backs:** Council of Chairs held a phone conference before classes started. Sawyer reported they had a guest, the President of SUA. He reported SUA will meet every other week with the off weeks being used for committee meetings. All representatives will serve on a second committee. TAPS will be holding student info workshops to discuss transportation and their spring referenda to increase parking fees.
