Local News: Santa Cruz police arrested a man Tuesday after he allegedly entered a high school with a machete, police said. According to police, 27-year-old Milton Miller of Santa Cruz went to Natural Bridges High School at 313 Swift St. and entered a classroom with a 13-inch machete. Officers responded to the scene, placed the school on lockdown and cleared the surrounding area. Officers then located and arrested Miller in the area of West Cliff Drive, police said. The arrest comes almost two months after Miller was arrested for a similar offense. On Sept. 20, Miller was seen walking near downtown Santa Cruz with a knife in his hand. When officers confronted him, he allegedly refused their orders and resisted arrest, police said. He was then arrested on suspicion of multiple offenses, including concealing a concealed dagger.

National News: Cards Against Humanity is known for unique stunts around this time of year. In years past, in an effort to combat Black Friday, they've had people send them \$5 and literally sent nothing in return. Just like they said they would. They've also mailed people poop in a box. 30,000 bought it. They've even raised \$100,000 to dig a giant hole in the ground. This year, they're taking on The President. The company says they've bought a plot of vacant land on the border of the United States and Mexico in an effort to make it difficult for President Trump to build his border wall. "We've purchased a plot of vacant land on the border and retained a law firm specializing in eminent domain to make it as time-consuming and expensive as possible for the wall to get built," the company said on their website. They are also asking people to donate to their campaign. "You give us \$15, and we'll send six America-saving surprises right to your doorstep," the company said. "It will be fun, it will be weird, and if you voted for Trump, you might want to sit this one out. "The company did not disclose where the piece of land is located, but said everyone who pitches in on day one will receive an illustrated map of the land.

BIZARRE NEWS: A rail company in Japan has apologized after one of its trains departed 20 seconds early. Management on the Tsukuba Express line between Tokyo and the city of Tsukuba say they "sincerely apologie for the inconvenience" caused. In a statement, the company said the train had been scheduled to leave at 9:44:40 local time but left at 9:44:20. Many social media users reacted to the company's apology with surprise. The mistake happened because staff had not checked the timetable, the company statement said. "The crew did not sufficiently check the departure time and performed the departure operation," it said. It added that no customers had complained about the early departure from Minami Nagareyama Station, which is just north of Tokyo. The Tsukuba Express line takes passengers from Akihabara in eastern Tokyo to Tsukuba in about 45 minutes. It is rare for trains in Japan, which has one of the world's most reliable railways, to depart at a different time to the one scheduled. The country's Tokaido line, which runs from Tokyo to the city of Kobe, is by far the world's busiest and carries nearly 150 million passengers a year. Impressed railway users worldwide tweeted the story to their local train operators - particularly in Britain, where rail services are often delayed.
