Transit services update from UCSC Transportation and Parking Services. We know buses are full. Ridership Trends: Day & Night Shuttled went up 15%; Metro ridership went up 12% in Oct. (Average 12,000. – 13,000. 1st day of classes, this year = 17,000.) Metro was able to add Route 22 which takes students down Western Dr. to the coastal science campus. Three articulated buses will be introduced in January, rented by UCSC and driven by S.C. Metro. This will fit 110 instead of 80 students each round. This include routes 10, 15, 16, 19 & 20. But, the TAPS budget is in a \$3 million deficit. Our campus has to deal with this deficit. Currently, the Student Transit Fee is \$111.66 per student per quarter and the annual budge last year was \$6,442,000. Last year, 4 focus group sessions were held for student feedback on a proposed fee increase and how to prioritize transportation needs. The results, although not scientific, come up with this order.

#1: Loop routes

- #4: Bike Shuttles
- #1: Metro services to UCSC

#2: Weekend Night Owl service

#4: Routes elsewhere in Santa Cruz#5: Weeknight Owl service

#3: Upper Campus route

#5: Night Core

#3: Expanded UCPD safe ride program TAPS has already reduced size/frequency of night shuttles. They were asked not to run in the 2017 spring election so OPERS could be the focus. Trying the keep the increase reasonable at \$40.- \$50 per quarter. Other findings: Safe Ride program could replace Night Core Routes, indexing student fees is too unpredictable, predictable fee increases would be supported if not too large, general support for increasing fee by \$40 per quarter, less for \$50. Sunset clause needs to be included.

Questions asked by Susan:

-Would you support increasing the Transit fee by \$40/\$50 per quarter?

-Should we have an annual indexing (adjusted for inflation) and/or a graduated increase? -How long for the sunset clause?

-If needed, how should we reduce transit services?

Plan: working on revised fee proposal for 2018 ballot. Continue outreach to students, looking for student allies to assist. Planning pop up events at bigger/crowded bus stops. Parliament suggest voter outreach election week via bus signs and advertising swag.

Discussion UCSC student fees are so high, highest in the whole system. San Diego has similar size campus and their fees are only \$50??? We really do need TAPS improvements...
