-IRB is conducting a hard copy survey used for actual research including questions about campus and housing improvements. This community-based participatory survey will shine light on the different housing conditions students are facing. For example, there is no standard permissible level of mold. The housing contracts over time need revision. On-campus students only have 3 days to vacate and that is not enough time. The survey requires a certified surveyor, on campus students please sign up to participate. The data will help students.

-SUA passed a resolution to endorse the rent control measure on the Santa Cruz City June ballot. SUA endorses rent control. The goal is to level out the playing field with landlords and renters. First, a rent cap; only increase rent based off of inflation and wages. Just Cause Eviction: landlords should need a reason to evict tenants. Rent board, create to regularly review progress. LOCAL NEWS: *WARNING: GRAPHIC CONTENT; SEXUAL VIOLENCE*

A woman fought off a stranger who tried to rip off her clothes and rape her at the Santa Cruz clock tower Wednesday evening, police told KSBW. The woman was walking by the clock tower on Pacific Avenue when a man, Daisuke Muro, jumped out and grabbed her. Muro, 40, tried to pull the woman's pants down as she fought back. "During the struggle the woman was pulled to the ground and Muro began to rip her clothes and attempted to pull her pants off. People in the immediate area hearing the woman screaming and witnessed what was occurring intervened. They pulled the woman up from being under Muro, and began to run away," Lt. Warren Barry said. He then stripped off his own clothes and began masturbating, police said. When police arrived, Muro charged at them and tried to attack the officers, police said. Muro was arrested on charges of attempted rape and assaulting a peace officer. The victim suffered bruises while struggling with Muro. Arrest records show that Muro was arrested just 24 hours before the clock tower attack. Police arrested Muro on Tuesday for loitering at the Santa Cruz Police Station on Center Street. The Santa Cruz Police Department is adding extra patrols downtown because of Wednesday's incident.

After searching for more than 40 years, authorities say an ex-cop is the Golden State Killer. DeAngelo, 72, was taken into custody Tuesday evening in the Sacramento suburb of Citrus Heights. Police allege he is the so-called Golden State Killer, who is believed to have committed 12 killings and at least 50 rapes in at least 10 counties in California. Detectives matched a discarded DNA sample from his home to evidence from the investigation, according to law enforcement officials who gathered outside the crime lab where the key break was uncovered. DeAngelo was arrested not far from where the Golden State killer committed some of his crimes. While officials would not say what led them to seek DeAngelo's DNA, they said his name emerged in connection with the crimes last week. He was arrested without incident. DeAngelo faces capital murder charges in connection with the killings of Katie and Brian Maggiore in 1978. He is being held without bail in Sacramento. He will be arraigned Friday afternoon. He also is accused of murder by authorities in Orange and Ventura counties, according to documents and officials.

BIZARRE NEWS: Finally, A Race For The Rest Of Us: 0.5K In Texas Includes Beer, Smoke Break. The inaugural Boerne (pronounced like Bernie) race is "500-ish" yards, or .3 miles. The "um, 'race,'" as its organizers call it, begins and ends with a free pint of beer. And at the halfway point, if you've burned through your carbs (.15 miles in), a doughnut and coffee hydration station is available for a carbo reload — right next to the costume contest and smoking area. The entry fee was \$25 before tickets sold out. All proceeds will go to Blessings in a Backpack, a charity organization that tackles food insecurity by supplying weekend meals for elementary school students who might otherwise go hungry. The uber-underachieving VIP, however, could pay an extra \$25 to be shuttled across the finish line in a restored 1963 VW bus. VIPs also get an *even bigger* medal, organizers say "because you are even more important!" The race is scheduled for May 5. Other perks of signing up include a "pretentious" 0.5k sticker, and a medical tent that may or may not be manned. ("546 yards is nothing to take too lightly.")
