Funding Requests: Scientific Slug – A commentary/arts magazine including research, creative projects and a game section in the back. Requesting \$300. for printing expenses and snacks. Producing 1000 full color copies, 32 pages + 4 sided cover at \$4.50 each. Publish each spring and distribute all over campus. Using local Community Printers who follow sustainable practices like supporting the community. Total budget is \$4500. + \$100 for snacks.

Matchbox Magazine in it's 13th year is a free creative writing mag produced here but accepting submissions from all UC's. Only campus mag. that distributes to all UC's. Fosters community between campuses and provides showcase for writing, art, audio submissions, poetry, prose etc. Last year received 600 submissions and printed 60. Also have a digital version available where the audio selections are available. Requesting \$400. of \$6800. Budget for printing expenses. Requesting funding from all colleges, SUA, local shops and hosting fundraisers. Outreach is done through Literature Departments across the system.

Election Results: Tuesday 11/6 was the midterm election. Current results are attached for national, state and county races and ballot measures.

National - Congress – over 100 women were elected including a record number of women of color.

House = Democrats take back majority 225/197 – need 218 votes to pass legislation

Prop 7 – Allow Daylight Saving Change passed 60/40

Prop 8 – Regulate Dialysis charges failed 62/38

Prop 11 – Expand EMT on call time passed 59.4/40.5

Prop 12 – Farm Animal Space min. passed 61/39

Measure H – Santa Cruz County affordable housing failed, needed 2/3rds – 51/48

Measure M – Rent Control failed, needed majority 66.8/33.2
