### Programs Fee Amendment Introduction – CPC Pam Ackerman

The CPC's are looking at a Programs Fee Increase ballot measure for spring 2019. Background, the fee started in 1965 at \$8. In 1982 it was raised to \$10. where it has stayed for 36 years. In the meantime, expenses and enrollment continues to rise. Costs include student staff salaries, general programming including orientation/graduation, office expenses, a desire to provide stipends for OL's and funds for student government allocation. Discussing a \$5 raise in fees from \$10 to \$15, and maybe +\$1/year for a total of \$20/quarter or \$60/year.

Parliament response;

- Long time since increase, students in general support
- Programs budget is getting pinched from multiple cost increases - acknowledged
- Positive response for stipend for Orientation Leaders
- Concern about number of fee ballot measures for spring 2019
- Sunset clause mandatory and not in favor of more than \$5 in total.
- Could another funding source be identified besides students?
- Can increasing police coverage expenses over commencement weekend be controlled?

**Parliament Updates:** SCOC Candidate responses to our email call = 13 people + 1 resumé!

Things to ask candidates: can you make the meetings on Wed 7-8 p.m.? Can you report to Parliament? Can you work with SUA Officers? Any student government experience? Michelle will work with Pam to develop questions and forward them to students for the break.
